



PREGNANCY TESTS

The majority of pregnancy tests are used to test your body for the hormone hCG, which your body will produce throughout the pregnancy.



Home pregnancy kits that test for hCG in urine

SAMPLING (CVS) \$1,300+

Most insurance providers cover CVS for high-risk pregnancies, but it can be subject to your deductible.

MATERNAL BLOOD SCREENING:

COST: VARIES BY LOCATION AND COVERAGE

This blood test looks for evidence of birth defects.

Analyzing the amniotic fluid can determine if the baby has any genetic conditions such as down syndrome.
